Afterwards they play the theme while Trombones, etc., revel in a striking counter melody. (7) Basses, etc., play "Three Blind Mice." (8) A duet for Cornets. (9) Medley for Basses, etc. (10) A Trombone Trio. (11) For we are Jolly Bandsmen? (12) Band sing the "Jolly Bandsmen's Chorus." (12) Finale.

Allegro vivace. -116. MEDLEY. Corts. & Drums only. Drums. Hrn, Bart. & Troms.

POP GOES THE WEASEL! Corts, Hrn, Euph. & Barts. Bass & Troms. *fs.*

Allegro Whistle. Hrn, & Barts. & S. D. to play. Troms. & Bass to Whistle. Euph. Solo.

Allegro moderato. -108. Band decide to sing another Chorus. (One Cornet to play, all others to sing) unis. Oh my! Is that possible? *rall.*
